## Public Survey

Zebra Mussel and Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Public Survey – 2024
Citizens for Protecting Our Northern Waterways Inc.
Final Draft
October 2024



A total of **183 surveys** were completed at outreach events

Consisted of nine (9) multiple choice questions designed to determine:

- type of water-based activities people are engaged in
- general knowledge of zebra mussels and other AIS
- knowledge of prevention methods including Clean-Drain-Dry (CDD)
- views about the most effective methods to further inform the public about zebra mussels and other AIS

# Survey Highlights

- Majority of respondents were anglers followed by beach goers
- 95% indicated they know about ZM's and other AIS & 79% say they are very concerned
- Results suggest high level of knowledge of AIS and CDD - but – the questions and answer options likely led participants to the correct answer thus falsely demonstrated this level of knowledge


- Surprizing number of respondents were unaware to pull the plug when transporting a watercraft
- When asked about transporting a watercraft from infected to uninfected waters, 34% either didn't know the difference between CDD and CDD plus decontaminate or did not know at all.
- When asked about the most effective way to inform the public, the top 2 suggestions were:
  - more inspection stations, and
  - more information provided when purchasing fishing license.

## Key Recommendations

- More information on the beach experience, including how to CDD and the need to decontaminate beach toys and associated equipment.
- Explicit messaging on what constitutes CDD and the requirement to "pull the plug" when transporting watercraft.
- Provide information on AIS and prevention directly to people who purchase on-line angling license.
- AIS handouts to people who stop at government inspection stations.
- Use of <u>easily accessed</u> videos via social media and various websites (what constitutes CDD, when to decontaminate)
- Need more inspection stations (emphasis on filling gap in Grand Rapids and Wabowden). Explore alternate approaches to fill these gaps including contract services

# **Government Liaison/Advocacy**

- Relationship with provincial AIS Unit staffers remains positive
- Excellent support from Joey Tonin re lake monitoring
- AIS Advisory Forum 2 meetings. Provided input into AIS Prevention & Resonse Plan released in July, 2024.
- CPONW previous recommendations emphasised including:
  - Increased public awareness and outreach
  - Expanded watercraft inspection and decontamination capacity, including contract services.
  - Expansion of hours of operation at inspection stations
- Next meeting TBD




# **Monitoring**

#### **CPONW Monitoring** (Substrate Samplers)

2024 ( sites increased from 12 to 18)

- Burntwood River, Paint Lk, Setting Lake, Snow Lk, Wekusko Lk (2), Tramping Lk Reed Lk, Iskwasum Landing, Kississing Lk, Naosap Lk, Bakers Narrows, Neso Lk, 1st Cranberry Lk, Barbe Lk, Rocky Lake, Clearwater (2)
- Two samplers were removed by unknown people (Naosap and Barbe)
- To date the following have been assessed:
   Burntwood River, Paint Lk, Setting Lake, Reed Lk, Iskwasum Landing, Kississing Lk and Rocky Lake. Good News none showed any evidence of ZM!




# Monitoring

#### **Stop Zebra Mussels**



#### **Protect Our Lakes**

Clean Means: watercraft and water-related equipment are free of zebra mussels, other Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS), vegetation, and mud.

Drain Means: no residual water in the watercraft, including live well and engine, lower boat motor to drain water from the lower unit, remove all drain plugs when transporting your craft to comply with Provincial AIS regulations. Dry Means: watercraft, ropes, lifejackets, other cear are dry prior to going in another waterbody.
